

CETA Implementation and Implications Project

Project Aims

The CETA Implementation and Implications Project (CIIP) will bring together scholars and stakeholders in Europe and Canada who are analyzing the programmatic and legislative changes required to bring CETA to fruition in Canada, at the EU level and in member states. The areas to be covered include many elements of this comprehensive agreement including investment, intellectual property, agricultural and other goods trade, environmental and labour elements and impacts.



Project activities will allow for scholarly investigation of the state of the Canada-EU trade partnership. By building these linkages, the project will analyse and evaluate the implementation of CETA subsequent to its ratification and provisional implementation in 2017.

Project Activities

Workshop: A workshop at Dalhousie University in May 2018 will give participants the opportunity to present their original research and engage with colleagues on the Canada-EU CETA agreement.

Conference: In 2019 a conference hosted by Dalhousie University will invite up to 50 participants to present their research on CETA implementation and the early implications of the agreement for legislation, regulation and public policy.

Publications: These events will be accompanied by the publication of papers to disseminate the analysis and spread information on CETA implementation from multiple scholarly and analytical perspectives
